I am now writing my last will and as such I wish
to be as plain as I can and I have therefore
written the same in the following manner
first I wish to bequeath to my eldest son Francis
one Negro fellow named John to have him at my death not having any other part
or claim in the said estate and if it please God to take me away from
this life to see my two young sons brought up that he the said Francis
Maurais on consideration of the said Negro man shall be obliged to give
them two years schooling upon provision the said Negroe lives and he the
said Francis Maurais neither swap sell nor convey the said Negroe
away and if the said Francis Maurais should be leaving not any
child lawfully begotten the said Negro to be given to my son William
as for the rest of my estate to be equally divided amongst the rest of
my children as follows Elizabeth William Samuel James Benjamin
Edward Nancy & Stephen Furthermore I ordain my son Francis
