at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and for my
Widely friends what I have bequeath I begeth begeth me
with all I possess thereof as followeth I bequeath I bequeath
my loving Wife Elizabeth Barker two old negroes that is William
and Sarah serving her natural Life then I give and bequeath unto
my daughter Elizabeth two negroes she named Anne daughter of
John and the same named William for of Sarah that and
then I bequeath to her and her three heirs and I give and
bequeath unto my son John the same negroes to be
equally divided my son John that is William Barker and
William Barker and their three heirs then I give and
bequeath to my son John that is William Barker and

and I give and bequeath unto my sons Daniel four
pounds and my loving and loving son the bearing of William
and William each obtained a right by Daniel Jerry, to him and his
heirs forever. I appoint that all the Rest of my Goods
and my Debt and to pay my Debt with and the over plus of the
Money that I have left for I give to my well beloved Wife
Ann I give and bequeath unto my three sons above named the increase of
land which comes hereafter before the Death of this Mother and after
her Death the two old Negroes to be divided equally between the 3
therefore give to them and their heirs forever. Furtherly I appoint
that my movable Estate that has not been all ready mentioned in
any part above may be sold to pay the Remainder of my Debt if
Required, I give and bequeath to my loving Wife the Remainder
and my out Debt. I constitute and appoint my loving son
and my Father Richard Parker and my Brother Rich Farrier
Executors of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof
I have set my hand and affixed my Seal this 24th Day of August 1741
