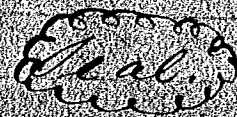


Know all men by these presents that I Elizabeth

publish and declare this my last will and testament,

during her life my Woman Daphney, and at

heirs forever, and I give my Silver Spoons to
my sister Agnes P. Burdson. I give and
bequeath to my nephew Thomas C. Burdson my
slaves Joe, Charles, George, and Ned to him and
his heirs forever. I give also to my nephew Thomas
C. Burdson my bed and bedstead, wash bowl and
pitcher and black walnut table and big cup and
saucers, also all of my stock of cows and I give to
my nephew Thomas C. Burdson any other property I may
have not disposed of specifically in this will to him
and his heirs forever. I give to my niece Eliza
H. Limer my Chest of Drawers, and to my nephew
Edward A. Brodnax I give twenty Dollars which =

amount I will and direct shall be paid him by
my nephew Thomas C. Bourdon, and I hereby
appoint my nephew Thomas C. Bourdon Executor
to this my last will and testament, in testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this the 18th day of July in
the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and
sixty four.
