once to die I do here make my last will and Testament in the
Following manner and form first and Principally I Recommend
my soul to god who gave it hoping through the merits of my Blessed
Saviour to obtain full and Perfect Remission of my sins and my body
I commit to the ground to be buried at the discretion of my executors
hereafter Named and as for such Worldly estate it hath pleased god to
Bestow on me I give and Dispose of in the Following manner and Form—

I in premis I Give and Devise to my Dear loving wife the Plantation
that I now live on During her life and not to be rented nor
least with out the consent of the ones that comes after her
I Give to my dear wife one Negro man named Robin to be
his hers for ever also one feather bed and Furniture and thirty
Pound current Money of virginia to her and her assigns for ever
I Give to my Dear loving wife one Negro woman named Sarah
and one bay mare and foal and half my stock of cattle
sheep and hogs and half my kitchen furniture
During her Natril life.

I Item I Give and Devise to my Brother Abner Jackson
my land after my Dear wife Death and every things else
that I have or shall have to him and his assigns for ever
also he is to pay all my just Debts also what I lend to my
Wife I leave to Abner Jackson after her Natril life
To him and his assigns for ever

and Lastly I do Give and Devise

Turn over

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and one bay mare and foal and half my stock of cattle
sheep and hogs and half my kitchen furniture
During her Natril life.

I then I give and Devise to my Brother Abner Jackson
my land after my Dear wife Death and every things else
that I have to him and his for ever
also he is to pay all my just Dets also what I lend to my
Wife I leave to Abner Jackson after his Natril life
To him and his for ever.
