weakness of body Do by this my last will and testament bestow
worldly goods and Chattles in manner following

I give to my Sister Elizabeth Mingham half my money
and the other half I leave in trust of my sister Elizabeth
for the benefit of my sister Elliot to be laid out as my sister
Elizabeth shall see occasion and what is not used of the said
half of my money in the life of Sister Elliot I give to my two
Nephews William and Henry Elliot to be equally divided between
them when they come to the age of twenty one years I give my
half of the Negro Steben between my sister Elizabeth and my
niece Martha Elliot I give my part of the land my brother
gave me to my sister Elizabeth and my sister Elliot for her
life and at her death ^{her part} to go to her two sons William and Henry
I likewise desire that Nathan yoncy may let Nathan Tenby
have five pounds current money of Virginia to purchase
him Sun Clothes which money the said yoncy is in debt to me
I charge the Stocks that my brother gave me of Cattel and
sheep give me to be sold ~~and~~ and the money that is with
them given I give to my sister ~~Elliot~~ and Chivers & Chivers
part to remain in my sister Elizabeth hands; in the above of
life I desire that like these 6 children that John Pooch of
York County had above birth may have each of them one
year schooling out of the said money that I give to my sisters
I do appoint James Kussel of Warwick County my Executor
Eli. Garton

A testament held for City & County October 28.

1795 This Will was presented in Court by the said
the said John Elliott to wit that the said John Elliott
and that Nathan Hanning came into Court and made
 oath that he was the said John Elliott's Will was made by
 the said John Elliott and that he was the said John Elliott's
 and on the Motion of Elizabeth M'Nigham who
 made a oath according to the law in this case
 granted her in the said Will annexed upon
 the said John Elliott's Will together
 with the said John Elliott's Will and the said
 acknowledged the said John Elliott's Will
 to be his last Will and Testament according to law.
