Item I give to my grandson Thomas Latimer son
 of Wm Latimer one silver table spoon
 to him and his heirs — and likewise my
 Corner coberd —

Item I give to my Granddaughter Ann Latimer
 Daughter to Th^o. Latimer two heifers two
 years of age & likewise one bead and
 furniture together with six silver tea
 spoons to her and her heirs —

Item I give to my son Th^o. Latimer my Gray
 Hair to him and his heirs —

Item I leave the rest of my Estate ungiven
 to be Equally Divided amongst all my
 Children & I do Appoint my sons

William and George my whole and
 sole Executors to this my Last will in
 Witness hereof I have set my hand and
 fixed my seal this 8th day of November
 1774 —
