life after my just debts and funeral Expences are first paid.

I give and bequeath to my Gr^a daughter Eliz^a Been my bed
and furniture also one Iron Pot, one Shovel, one frying pan a
longs and Shovel to her and her heirs forever.

Item I leave my Negro woman Patt to be sold, and to those
her Master, Also I leave my Stock to be sold for Cash at a years
Credit together with the remaining part of my Household
furniture at the same Credit

Item I give to Martha Been my wearing clothes together with
the Trunk that holds them. Item my Desire is that my Grand-
son James may be supported till he be big enough to be bound
out, out of the Interest of the money arising from the sale
and the remaining part of the said money arising from
the sale after giving to my said Granddaughter Elizabeth
Been thirty shillings to be equally Divided between my
three Grandchildren Martha Been John Been and James
Been Share and Share alike as they come of age and lastly
I appoint John Skinner Executor of this my last Will and
Testament hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore
made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and Seal the day and year above written.
