Chair & one small chair and after her decease I
give the same to my son Charles Tucker this
I give for ever.

Item I give to my wife Rosa Tucker is that my Copper Still be kept
on for the use of my wife & after her
decease (during her life) and after her decease I give the
said Still to my son Charles Tucker. But my Tucker will
that they have the liberty of it for their own
Private use during their natural lives.

Item I give to my Daughter Mary Armistead six new
Silver Spoons my writing Desk, Sea leather Chair &
Bed and Furniture & my Riding mare to her and
her heirs for ever.

Item I give to my Daughter Sarah Dixon after my wife
decease six Silver Spoons to her & her heirs for ever.

Item I give to my Loving wife my Riding Chair & Two
small mares also my brood of Corn pease & fodder

Item I send to my wife Rosa Tucker all the Remaining Part of
my life during her natural life and after her
decease I give the same equally divided amongst my Children
and after my death I give my Loving wife Rosa Tucker &
her heirs all my last will & testament & I have
signed & sealed my hand & seal this 15th Sept. 1758
