I Charles Wayley of the County of
Elizabeth City in the State of Virginia be
ing sick & weak but of perfect mind
and memory do make, constitute and
re-assign this as my last Will and Tes-
tament —

I leave to my loving Wife Frances
Wayley all my Estate both real and
personal, during her life or Widowhood
and at her death or marriage I give
my Estate as follows —

To my Son William Wayley I give
one third part of my landed Estate as
also one third part of my Negroes, Stock
of Cattle, Horses, Sheep & Hogs to him and
his Heirs for ever —

To my Son Charles Wayley I
give one other third part of my land-
ed Estate, as also one other third part of
my Negroes, Stock of Cattle, Horses, Sheep
& Hogs to him & his Heirs forever —

To my Son Thomas Wayley I give
the remaining third part of my land-
ed Estate, as also the remaining third
part of my Negroes, Stock of Cattle,
Horses, Sheep & Hogs to him and his
Heirs forever —

And it is my further Will & desire
that after my just debts are paid, that
all Bonds, notes and open accounts due
me shall be collected and kept toge-
ther for the use and benefit of my
loving Wife and Children, and at
the Death or Marriage of my loving
Wife, the Bonds, notes or open accounts
remaining on Hand or that may ap-
pear to be due me together with
other property not named in this
said Will shall be equally divided
between my three Sons as William,
Charles and Thomas Wayleys —

And I do hereby nominate and
appoint my loving Wife Frances
Wayley executrix and my Son Wil-
liam & my Son George Wayley
of this my last Will & Testament and
to carry the same into effect —
