 by the Name of Brethens, to my son John Latimer and his heirs for E  
 fully together of his, twenty and five years I give him my said son John two Negro  
 by name Ned and Leah to be kept when he arrives to twenty years of age; I give to  
 my son Thos Latimer, & to the wife the whole of my Harbors Creek  
 plantation to him and his heirs, or assigns, and to have an equal part of my negroes  
 when he arrives to be with it age, to him & his heirs for ever. I give to my  
 daughter Jane With One negro Boy, Frederick, to her and her heirs for ever —  
 I give my son George Latimer One Negro man Anna-muel, to him and his  
 heirs for ever, and One hundred pounds to be raised on Leases out of my Estate  
 One hundred pounds. It is to be paid after the death of my wife and in life  
 to George Latimer, his heirs or assigns, the said Negro & money to be  
 out of my Estate & upon my father's intent and meaning is that if either  
 of my said sons John or Thos Latimer shall die without heirs, that the part of  
 the said son John or Thos Latimer shall go to my son George I should see my wife  
 the said part of the said son John or Thos Latimer shall go to my son George I should see my wife

my surviving children or their heirs forever, I then give my daughter  
 another step by James Will, to her and her heirs for ever, then I give my daughter  
 Latimer my living half and said the whole to her and her heirs forever. Then I give  
 the remainder of my Estate to my first death as heirs to be equally divided  
 amongst these my four children Anne, Mary, Barbara, & George Latimer, to them &
 their heirs, for ever. Lastly begetter of these Boys, to have their day part as they
 come to Eighteen years of age or marriage and no in case my beloved wife should die before  
 my daughter Barbara arrives to Eighteen years of age or Marriage my desire is that she should  
 draw her share of the estate over, & these my four children Anne & Mary Barbara  
 & George Latimer for her use while her mother and then the said I agree to return to  
 said Anne, then I give my son & daughter John & his heirs, as I have the other  
 where of I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 13 day of November 1788
