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I give to my Loving Wife Hellen Wray
all the furniture belonging to my Dwelling
House & Kitchen; excepting some particulars
which I shall give my children; Likewise I
give her Six hundred Pounds Virginia Curance
I give her my Negro Wench Hager - & my
negro fellow Pharoah - & Terre - & my
negro fellow Jack & a negro girl called Melie

I give to my Son Jacob Wray & to his heirs
of his Body Lawfully Begotten my three
houses in England being in Poplar nere
London - & my Dwelling House & Kitchen
with the third part of the Lotts adjoining to
Mr Charls Denings - after is Mother's Death
& I give him Ten Pounds Cash - He having
had Six hundred Pounds, already - I give
him my Boy Argoll

I give to my Son George Wray the third
part of 2 Lotts adjoining to Mr Arche Bollins
(which I bought of Mr Charls Denings) to him
& his heirs Lawfully Begotten - & I give him
Six hundred Pounds Cash & my Large
Silver Tankard after is Mother's Death - &
I give him my negro fellow Demory
& my negro fellow Cello Poplar

on the other side

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I give my Daughter ~~Ann Smith~~ Ann Smith
One ~~hundred~~ hundred Pounds Cash - & my spinnetts
& I give her my Negro Wench Lucy with
her accretes

I give to my Son James Wray my Land
in Appamatox (which I bought of Cap. Taylor)
to him & his heirs Lawfully begotten
& I give him Six hundred Pounds Cash
& my negro Boy tolly (which was Jangison)

I give to my Son Keith Wray a third
part of 2 Lotts (which is between my Son
Jacob & George, that part which I now
keep thopen) & I give him
Six hundred Pounds Cash & I give him
my Negro Boy ned (which is Terry's Son)

I give to the Parish of ~~East~~ ^{East} ~~City~~ ^{City}
to be sent for; new out of England, the
three Large folio Volumes of
Foxes Martrolyge - & three Vols
of Judge Hailly - Contemplation Morvall
& Devine - & four Books Titled a short
Method with the Deists & a Letter to the Deists.
I desire that they may be kept in the
Vestry room; for any people that are enclined
to read - a Sunday Morning before they go into
Church - or at any other time -

And all & every part of my Estate both
Negros; Stock of every sort - household goods,
wares & Merchandise Money & plate not
before given in this my Last Will - I desire
may be equally Deviced to my Loving
Wife & my five Children Jacob -
George - Ann - James - & Keith -

& my son Jacob Wray; & my son George Wray
& my Daughter Ann Wray ^{Ann Stith} ~~Wray~~
