I commit my soul into the arms of my most merciful Redeemer & Saviour Christ Jesus hoping and believing through his merits to receive the full pardon and remission of all my sins and my body I commit to the earth decently to be interred and as for my worldly estate I give and bequeath as follows. I give and devise unto my Cousin George Arnold of the Kingdom of England and Merchant in London all my right title and interest which I have in and to certain Messuages and tenements in the Kingdom of England and Burrough of Hatherly Commonly called and known by the name of Wadlands and Finch parks to him and his heirs forever in consideration of part of the debt which I owe to him.

Item I give unto my Cousin John Bolden the Sum of twenty pounds to be taken out of my estate in what he pleases (excepting the plate which I brought from England which so plate ^{is} in my Cousin Arnolds charge and the disposal of as he thinks fit) I also give to my Cousin Bolden those books viz all my law books the whole duty of man and Sherlock on Davidome & ^{the} ^{other} ^{books} ^{which} ^{are} ^{given} ⁱⁿ ^{consideration} ^{of} ^{the} ^{great} ^{trouble} ^{he} ^{will} ^{probably} ^{have} ⁱⁿ ^{getting} ⁱⁿ ^{my} ^{debts} &c

Item I give unto my Cousin Elizabeth Bolden a book entitled Augustines Meditations

Item I give unto Joseph the son of my Cousin John Bolden those books viz my Dictionary & Crescents

Item I give unto Elizabeth the daughter of my Cousin Bolden one Silver Ribbon & a book entitled The Mothers Blessing.

Item I give unto Robert Brough son of William Brough D.D. those books viz Owens epigrams. Newses Catachism. Thomas A Kempis in Latin and one in English. Sherlock on Judgment and the five bishops and three doctors.

Item I give to Mary the daughter of my Cousin Bolden
Item it is my will & desire if my Cousin Arnold shall think proper to grant my request that my wives Chables be

Divided behest her children & grandchildren viz I give to her
daughter Mary one new gown not finished one old stuff gown
and what els my executor John Bolton shall think fitt
I then I give unto her granddaughter Agnes Howard one yellow
steeple gown and Petticoat and what els of the cloths my
Exeutor shall think fit I also give her my Oval Table
and six old leather Chairs & 1 book viz the five Bishops & three Doctors
and Thomas & Kempis
I then I give unto her granddaughter Anne Howard one
gown and such other part of the cloths as my Exeutor
shall think proper
I then I give unto her granddaughter Mary Douglas one old gown
I then all the remaining part of my Exeutors clothes I give
to my daughter Grace Bolton

Then I nominate and appoint my trusty and well beloved
friends my Cousen George Arnold of the Kingdom of
England aforesd and my Cousen John Bolton of the
Colony of Virginia Exeutors of this my last will and
testament hereby revoking all former wills by me
made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this fifteenth day of March 1742

Then it is my further will that my Estate be not appraised
or my Exeutor held to security
