

In the Name of God. Amen. I Hannah Averra being sick
and weak, but in my perfect sense, and memory, do make
my last will, and Testament. in the following manner. Viz—
Imprimis: My will and desire is that my Nephew Thomas Averra
shall have my plantation which I lately lived on; & that
he should take it in full satisfaction for the money I owe him— agree
to my agreement with him. —

Item. It is my will and desire that all the rest of my Estate
should be sold to discharge the other debts due from me.
my will and desire is that if there is estate enough to pay
my just debts without selling my Cattle; in that case I desire
my Sister Hurstly Brittain may have one Cow, at her choice
my will and desire is that Rob^t: Kebling Brown, who now
lives in my House, may not be disturbed in any shape
by any Person, until my Nephew Thomas Averra comes down
Item, my will and desire is that my Sister Hurstly Brittain, and
Elizabeth Brown, Rob^t: Brown's Wife, may divide the ~~the~~ Cattle
I leave. And I acknowledge that I have no right, title, nor claim
to the Negro Girl page; but that the said Negro is the prop-
erty of Mr. James Ball, of Lancaster County.

I do hereby appoint Capt. Miles King my Sole Executor, of this
last will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto signed
my name & affixed my Seal this 14th day of September 1778
