In the following Manner

Item I give and bequeathe to my son Nehemiah Nicholls during his
life all this my Plantation whereon I now dwell up to a line of
trees I formerly made a cross the Land near against W^m Merritts
at my said sons death I bequeathe the said Land to my Grandson
Joseph Nicholls & his heirs for Ever

Item I give & bequeathe to my Grandson Joseph Nicholls all the remainder
part of this my said plantation beyond the said line of marked trees unto
the head thereof which bounds on the line of Ger^d Roberts & Anthony Armistead
to him my said Grandson & his heirs for Ever

Item my will & desire is that all the rest of my Estate unbecuathed &
& not ^{herebefore} mentioned in this my will such as Slaves Cattle horses household goods
and all other Estate be it of what nature soever, be appraised according
to Law so soon as it conveniently can after my decease and that the whole
amount of the said appraisment after my Just debts & funeral Expences be
deducted, be equally divided between my son Nehemiah & four Grand
Children viz Tho^s Joseph Jane & Eliz^a Nicholls. Item my will & desire
is that my Executor hereafter mentioned shall pay to each of my Grand
Children their respective dividends of the said appraisment when they
come to the age of twenty one years or married without any profitte
or interest arising from the same. Item I doe Constitute and appoint my

Son Nehemiah Nicholls my Whole & sole Executor of this my
Will & Testament revoking and making void all other wills
heretofore made In Witness whereof I have set my hand and
written this 11th day of August 1742
