also ~~one~~ one bed and furniture to her
and her heirs for ever

I also give to my daughter a Gray mare & Cattle
at the rest of my Estate of what kind so ever
I give to my son William Bennit after
paying my Just Debts. and lastly I
nominate my son William Bennit
my beccator of this my last will and
Testament Revoking all former wills
by me heretofore made In Testimony
whereof I have here unto set my hand
and affixed my Seal this 24th Decr. 1769
