County and State of Virginia being Sick and weak in body but
thanko be to almighty God am in perfect Senses and sound and
memory Revoking all other wills made or said to be made by
me do constitute and ordain this to be my last will and
Testament in manner and form following -

- first I lend to my loving wife Elizabeth King all my Estate Real and
personal for and during the term of her natural life or widowhood
and if in case my wife should marry then and in that case I only
lend her one third of all my Estate Real and personal for and during
the term of her natural life -
- Secondly I give and bequeath to my son John Cule King at my wifes death
my houses and lands wherein I now live containing by Estimate
one hundred and three acres be the same more or less to him and his
heirs for ever -
- Thirdly I give and bequeath to my two Children namely Hannah Herbert
King and John Cule King at my wifes marriage two thirds of
all my personal Estate to be Equally divided between them ^{as soon} as
of age or marry and after my wifes death I give all my personal
Estate to be Equally divided betwixen my two Children before
named -
- Fourthly my further will and desire is that my Negro man will be sold
immediately after my decease and the money arising from the
Sale of him to purchase another negro or Negresses which said negro
or negresses purchased with the money rising from the sale of said
negro will I give to my daughter Hannah Herbert King and her
heirs for ever -
- Fifthly I give and bequeath to each of my Children one hundred pound
to be put upon Interest until they come of age or marry
- Sixthly and lastly I nominate and appoint my loving wife Elizabeth King
and my friend Samuel Datt Executors to this my last will and
Testament. in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my Seal the 20 of January one thousand eighteen hundred -
