I John Page of Buck Roe in the County of Elizabeth City, being in a low state of Health, full of pains Judgement, and apprehending from recent circumstances a speedy dissolution, and being anxious to settle my worldly affairs before that period, do make this, and by these Wishes to confirm it, my last & will and Testament in manner and form following, viz. I bequeath I consign my body to the Earth and my spirit into the hands of ~~that~~ Power which created it. The living with firm confidence that the Blood shed by our Blessed Saviour Jesus Christ for the salvation of Mankind, will wash away any sins I may have committed during my stay on this terrestrial Ball. Secondly, it is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid with the most scrupulous exactness, for which purpose I have in the hands of my Brother William Byrd Page in the County of ~~the~~ Fairfax in Virginia Bonds of Affidavits of the County of Berkeley, the Interest of which Bonds will I think be sufficient to discharge any claim that may arise against me. But should that be insufficient it is my will and desire that Doctor Wilson Cary

Selden he made to pay the balance of a contract made between us for the land
I now live on called Buck Roe, and which is recorded in the County Court of Eliza-
bette City. Thirdly I give and bequeath, for her exemplary conduct to me during
my life, all my property, both Real and Personal, to my wife Eliza beth Heng Page
to keep as long as she may live; and after her decease it is my desire that it shall
descend to my Brother's and Sister's children namely William Byrd Page, Mary charr
Page, Edward Swann, Mary Swann, and Thomas Swann to be equally divided between
them. Fourthly I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Heng Page all the
property ~~with~~ she brought me at our marriage to dispose of as she pleases for ever.
And whereas I have about part of that property, it is my will and desire that in line
thereof there be hundred pounds of Ferdinando Spotsface Esq? to dispose of as she
out of the above mentioned bonds of Ferdinando Spotsface Esq? to give to hundred pounds
pictures for ever. Fifthly it is my last will and desire that I give to hundred pounds
out of the same bonds to be given to my reputed son John Page Barron of Stamps
ton, Virginia, to educate and bring him up. Sixthly and lastly I leave my said
wife, whoe and sold Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. In wit-
