Colon Legged Negro Wife at the Quarter then two children the Negroes
and money to be Delivered her at twenty one years of age or day of Marriage
by my Exor hereafter. Varned Item I give and bequeath unto Michael
Dalton twenty pounds current money to be paid him at twenty one
years of age by my Exor Item it is my Desire that the house & Land
Commonly called the half way house between York & Hampton after the
Expiration of a full Term of years be sold & the money arising therefrom
be Equally Divided between Michael Dalton Mary Dalton & Mary
Noden when they come to age or day of Marriage. Item I give and
bequeath to Benjamin Sister the son of Mary Daley my Land
Joining to Elkston Town together with all the houses out houses &
Richards & all other conveniences there unto belonging to him & the
Heirs ~~after death~~ Lawfully begotten of his body forever Item
it is my will that the two Hundred & fourteen acres of Land in the
County of Savannah which I bought of Capt. William Dalton deceased be
sold or let at the Discretion of my Exor for the good of the Benjamin
Sister Item all the rest of my Estate both real & personal after my
Legacies herein before ^{after} hereafter given in this my will and all my
just debts be duly paid & funeral charges also paid I give and
bequeath unto the said Benjamin Sister son of Mary Daley Item
I give unto Richard Ambler of York Esq. the sum of twenty pounds
current money of Virginia to be collected out of my full Estate by
do hereby appoint the said Richard Ambler Esq. my sole & only Guardian
to the said Benjamin Sister and do hereby utterly Disallow revoke &
annul all and every other former testaments wills Legacies &
Deeds by me in any way before this time Varned: will & bequeath
ratifying and confirming this & no other to be my last will and
