 I do give my Black man, Black, Hannah and Peter
 Theirs after paying my just Debt to be by them
 Finally I bequeath
 My Wife a Negro Woman called Fatha also a Girl called Fatha
 And a Boy called Obeninto my two Daughters
 Sarah, Sarah and Jane to be by them Equally
 Divided to them and their Heir for ever
 My Will and bequeath is that my Daughters Elizabeth, Sarah
