First & principally I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it. my body I commit to the Earth, to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executor hereafter mentioned. and as touching such temporal Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me in this World. I give & dispose of the same in the manner & form following.

I promises. First it is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid & discharged by my Executor

Hem. I give and bequeath the whole of my Estate, and effects to my two Children, vizt. Elizabeth & Mary to be equally divided between them, and in case that either of them should die before they arrive to the age of eighteen, or marry, it is my will and desire that the said Estate then devolve upon the surviving daughter and her Heirs for ever

I do hereby nominate and appoint Mr. George Dooley my Executor of this my last Will & Testament -
