

In the Northern Neck County of Maryland I Jacob Sanders of
Elizabeth City County do make this my last will
and Testament in manner & form as followeth
First I recommend my soul into the hands of God
who gave it me & to what ~~the~~ worldly estate I
have pleased God to bestow on me I give &
bequeath in mannered form as followeth -
I then my wife & desire is that my Negro man will
should be hired out for my Executor hereafter -
named for seven years, the first three years his I give
unto my son Robt Sanders towards boarding clothing &
feeding him, the fourth year his I give unto my
Daughter Mary Sanders, the fifth year his I
give unto my Daughter Ann Sanders, the sixth
year his I give unto my Grand Daughter Mary
Sanders, & the seventh year his I give to be
divided ~~equally~~ between my other two Grand
Children James Sanders Wilson, & Ann Wilson.
~~My wife & desire~~ - my wife & desire further is that at
the expiration of the seven years hire of my said
Negro - I then give the said Negro will unto
son Robert Sanders to him & his heirs for ever
I then I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Sanders my
Gill Nanny to her & her heirs for ever on condition
says unto my son James Sanders three pounds -

I then I give unto my son James Sanders my
Baker & four Chairs -

I then my wife & desire is that after my last
debt be paid all the rest of my estate I
what ever ~~hence~~ I give ~~unto~~ to be Equally
divided between my daughter Mary-
anne Ann Sanders to them & their
Heirs for ever & lastly I appoint my
friend George Booker my Executor

to this my last will in witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
second day of July 1794
