Question Were you personally and intimately acquainted with the Father of Samuel Walls the present Plaintiff.

Answer Yes as well acquainted as with my own child.

Question Were you personally and intimately acquainted with Matthew & Thos. Walls who were living in the said town in dispute between Saml. Walls the present Plaintiff and Miles King?

Answer Yes that I was as well as my own children.

Question What do you suppose was the age of Matthew and Thos. Walls at the time you first knew them.

Answer They were Boys I suppose about nine or ten years old.

Question Were you particularly acquainted with the Mother of Matthew & Thos. Walls?

Answer Yes that I was well acquainted with her and was in the habit of visiting her frequently.
