Sense and Memory, Do make and Ordain this to be my last
Will and Testament in Manner and form following
I Primes, I Give and bequeath unto my son John Seaton
the Plantation whereon I now live to him and his
Heirs for Ever when he arrives to the Age of twenty
years, and in Case he should die before he comes
to the years of twenty One, then my further will is
desire that my son George should Enjoy the said Land
given to my said son John, and is to be for Ever
Also I Give unto my son John the Bay Horse Colt, and
all the Household and Kitchen furniture to him his Heirs for
Ever

Item I Give unto my son Thomas Seaton two Young
Hiesers to him & his Heirs for Ever

Item I Give unto my Daughter Jane Watts two Beds and
furniture to her and her Heirs for Ever

Item I Give unto my son George Seaton one Bed &
furniture to him and his Heirs for Ever,

Item I Give the Remainder of my Estate to be equally
divided between my Daughter Jane Watts and my
son John Seaton (after all my just debts are
paid) to them and their Heirs for Ever

I Nominate and Appoint Mr Thomas Watts and John
to be sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament as
Witness my Hand and seal this eighth day of April 1794
