and all other my Property whatsoever & wheresoever. And at the Decease of
my aforesaid Uncle & Aunt: Then my Will is that the aforesaid Negroes Lender &
her Increase with Jim Jeffery & Joe be Enfranchised. Remitted & set
free and Enjoy their Freedom in every Respect as if they had been free
born without any Let or Molestation of any Person & Perform whatsoever.

Furthermore I do bequeath unto my Cousin Catharine Armistead One Bed
Six Mahogony Leather Bottomed Chairs One large Cool Table & one large
Bible. And at her Death I do give the aforesaid Furniture to her Surviving
Child but should my aforesaid Cousin Catharine Armistead Die Childless
Then my Will & Desire is that the aforesaid Furniture be given to my
Cousin Mary Carleton Junr to her and her Heirs for Ever

Then I give unto my Cousin Susanna Mitchell One Bed One Mahogony
Desk One small Table One Candle Stand Eight Silver Tea Spoons &
One pair Sugar Tongs to her & her Heirs for Ever. And do hereby
Nominate & Appoint my aforesaid Uncle Fran Riddlehurst and my
Friend John Perry Sole Executors to this my last Will & Testament
And I do Declare this Will & no Other to be my last Will & Testament. In
