

In the Name of God Amen. Miles Cary of Calcutta in England being law
 in sound Mind & perfect Sense, do constitute & appoint this my last Will
 in manner & Form following viz: I recommend my Soul to the Mercy of my
 Father & my Body to be interred at Rich Newby my Ex^{ts} hereafter named
 Imp^t I give to my br. Sister Mary Selden if living at my decease the sum
 of fifty pounds, Curr^t Money, my Easy Chair & half the new Goods
 in my House & all the Children's Cloathing for my Negroes excepted
 I give to my Nephew Cary Selden my Chair & Horse, & all my Kitchen
 & Household Furniture the Furniture of my Hall excepted which
 I give to my Brother Wilson Cary
 I give to my Nephew Selden my Troopers Arms
 I give to my Nephew Miles Selden my Dowling Gun & my Gold the value
 of thirty pounds Curr^t Money & a plain Gold Ring
 I give to my Niece Anne Nicholas thirty pounds Curr^t Money & a plain Gold Ring
 I give to my Niece Elizabeth Cary thirty pounds Curr^t Money & a plain Gold Ring
 I give my Negro Girl named Nancy & her increase
 all my Plate and a Ring with Diamond & Spark, & if he dies
 under Age then the said legacy I give to his Father my Brother Wilson
 or taken up on what lands I shall hereafter buy being all being
 in King & Queens County to him & to the Heirs Male of his Body
 lawfully begotten for ever failing Heirs Male to his Heir Female
 when I shall have paid long ago to my Brother William Roscow the
 the sum of Two Hundred & thirty pounds, one shilling & six pence & Curr^t Money
 in part of the sum of Three Hundred pounds, one shilling & six pence & Curr^t Money
 + out in buying a tract of land of that Value for his son
 Roscow now of the said sum & Roscow proved a good Boy and
 keeps close to his Book or any other Business he is put to then
 I give the P^r James Roscow when he arrives at full age the sum
 of Ninety pounds & eight shillings & six pence Curr^t Money being half of the P^r 180
 but if he proves an Obdurate foolish Boy & will not keep to his Book
 or other Business then I give the said Balance of 180
 to his Brother Wilson Roscow when he arrives at full age
 I give to Mrs Catherine Burkshaw on the sole Condition that she
 continues to live with me till the time of my Death & otherwise
 for the great Care & trouble she has had in my family the said & her Land
 of 10 Acres & 100 Blankets & Linnen & Linnen & Linnen & Linnen & Linnen
 and all the new Goods & such I have sent for her own proper Use either
 in my House or sent for to England the year 1781 & 1782 & 1783 & 1784
 which all the Tea Coffee Chocolate & Spice & Sugar in my
 at the time of my Death my Negro Blanch & Judy & her children & my
 their Insurance more over I give my Ex^{ts} will as soon as possible
 offers out upon Interest One Hundred pounds Curr^t Money on
 good security & pay her the Interest arising from the said Money
 yearly when need as long as she shall live & after her
 death I give the said Hundred pounds to be equally divided
 between my Three Nephews Cary, Samuel & Miles Selden &
 any of them shall die their part to the eldest Child they have
 I give to my Three Nephews Cary, Samuel & Miles Selden after
 the paym^t of my just Debts & the above several legacies & after
 money I shall leave here or in England or is due to me at the
 time of my decease in Bonds or specially Mortgages of land
 excepted which I hereby give & assign over to my Brother
 Wilson Cary or in case of his Death to his son Wilson Miles Cary

I give also to my said three nephews Cary Samuel & Miles & also
what Crops of Tob^o after paying my Overseers & the Negroes Pay of
& Charges of getting down to the Washhouses the whole Crop of Tobacco
but not Corn Fodder Wheat &c which should have gone with my land
& Negroes if I dye after October the Crop of Tob^o then made the 1st
finished with said Money Bonds or specially Mortgages of Land
before accepted & Tobacco I give to be equally divided
between my said three nephews Cary Samuel & Miles & also
if living & if any of them shall be dead I give their part to the
eldest Child they shall leave instead of it & their death

I Give & bequeath to my loving Brother Wilton Cary whom
I by these presents constitute & appoint my sole & exclusive
Residuary Legatee all the residue & remainder of my
estate & effects in whatsoever manner I am now or
in my Possession or which may or shall hereafter be in
my Possession or to which I have an equitable claim or
Right or in Negro's Stocks Goods Money here or in Britain
or any where free Mortgages of Lands or Slaves or anything
else whatsoever not before by me specifically given or
disposed off to my said Brother Wilton Cary & also his
Heirs for ever & if he die I hereby appoint his or my said Legatee

I hereby release to all my Brothers, Sisters Nephews
& Nieces whatever Sum or Sums of Money they
do or shall owe me at my Decease whether in Bonds
or Book Debts

Whereas my Brother Wilton Cary whom I have
by these presents appointed my sole & exclusive
Residuary Legatee if my said Brother shall dye before me
I hereby nominate & appoint Mr. Robert Knicker
Nicholas & my Nephew Wilton Miles Cary
when he shall arrive at the age of Twenty one
years to & to this my Will in & from my Brother
dying before me & I hereby give to the said Mr
Robert Knicker Nicholas Master of Twenty Pound last
Money for his doublets he paid as I lay in & I give
in my Will & lastly I do hereby revoke & annul all
former Wills or Codicils of Wills by me heretofore made
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand
& Seal this 11th day of October 1752
