of the County of Glouc City, being of sound senel and
memory do make constitute and appoint this my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following

Item I leave all my household goods and furniture
to my wife Elizabeth, during her
life. I leave all my land and tenements to my son
William, Monley, and to my daughter Sarah, Becket,
Richard, Mary, and John, and to my son Anthony, Young Jeffrey,
Sally, and my son-in-law, together with my
single Chair and my mare, also sixteen head Cattle
Twenty head Sheep, and the Cart and two Yoke Oxen,
two Bees and furniture, with one third part of the
house hold and kitchen furniture together with one
year's provision of Corn &c.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Judith Cude,
and Eli. Monley, my two young Slaves (viz) Great Bob,
Jack, Harry, Beiter, Mary Tenev, Manner, Loe, Dinah,
red-eyed Jeffrey, Black Sarah, Richard, Frank, and Charles,
with their share of the house hold furniture, and their
and their heirs, and my Will and desire is that if
either of my said Daughters, shall die before they
come of age or marry, that the surviving one to pos-
sess the whole, I also desire that my Daughters may
be gently brought up, and when either of them
comes of age or marries, the above Estate with the
profits arising of the same, after having for their
Education be equally divided between them, on condition
that they are the persons for them by suite,
or otherwise, and my slaves, that I have
herein devised, shall be free, and my desire is further that
if either of my said Daughters shall die before they come
of age or marry, that the whole Estate herein bequeathed
be equally divided between the other three Sons William

Moreley and my son-in-law, and my daughter Judith Cude my single Chair
and young bay mare.

Item I give to my Daughter Eli. Monley my young sorrel
mare.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son William, all my
land and tenements in the aforesaid County, to him

Gene and his Heirs.

It is my further Will and desire that my three
Sons William, Morley, and Anthony, have their
equal parts of the Negroes I have with me,
Nepher, when I am dead. My wife, comes of age or
marries -

Item I gave the Colt of the year

I give my Gun to Robt. Armstrong Long

He is also my Will and desire that
all the residue of my Estate abroad
deposited after my last ^{will} and paid be equally
divided between Judith Ceele, Eli^a Moreley,
William Moreley & Anthony ^{sons}
and the money put on Interest until they
come of age or marry. It is also my Will
and desire that if either of my Sons die,
before they come of age or marry, that his
part of the negroes, cattle, money, &c. be divided
between the two surviving ones. and in
case all my Sons die before they come of
age or marry, that their Estates, both real
and personal be equally divided between
my two Daughters. or in case of death of either
of them the survivor shall have the whole.
The wife to appoint my Executors as follows
to wit the whole of my Estate as above
last Will and testament given under
my hand and seal this 20 day of February
