I Item I leave the use of my plantation my Negroes John
& Pompey and my Negro Child Rachel my household Goods
and all my Stock to my loving Wife Phillis Perne during
her Widowhood and to have the liberty to make use of the
Wood off the plantation off of that part of the Land she cleared
towards the support & maintenance of my Wife & Children

I Item I give & bequeath my said plantation after my Wife's
Widowhood to my loving Son Perneel Perne & his heirs
for ever and in case he dies without heir of his body then I
give the said Land to be equally Divided between my two
Daughters Ann Perne and Mary Perne & their heirs forever

I Item I give & bequeath my Negroes Pompey & my said Negro Child
Rachel together with all my said household goods & my said Stock
to be equally Divided between my following Children viz.
my Son Perneel Perne & Ann Perne & Mary Perne.

I Item my Will & desire is that what money I have in the house
which is thirty Pounds to be laid out in necessary building
upon my said plantation at the Discretion of my said

Perne Perne

And lastly I do nominate and constitute full power to my
 Loving Wife and Heirs once to be my Executors of
 this my last Will & Testament and to execute and discharge
 all other wills & Wills here before made by me in this
 witness I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fourth
 Day of January in the Year of our Lord 1755.

Item I give and bequeath my Will and Desire is that all my just debts
and funeral Charges be first paid —

Item I give and bequeath the use of my Plantation, my Negro Fellow
Pompey and my Negro Child Rachel my household Goods
and all my Stock to my Loving Wife Phillis Penne during
her Widowhood and to have the Liberty to make use of the
Wood off the Plantation off of that part of the Land she
clears towards the support and maintainance of my said
wife and Children —

Item I give and bequeath my said Plantation after
my Wife's Widowhood to my Loving Son Penuel Penne
and his Heirs for ever, and in case he dies without
heir of his Body, then I give the said Land to be equally
divided between my two Daughters Ann Powers and
Mary Penne and their Heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath my Negro Pompey and my
said Negro Child Rachel together with all my said
Household Goods and my said Stock to be equally divided
between my son Penuel Penne and Ann Penne and
Mary Penne

Item I give and bequeath my Will and Desire is that what money I have
in the house which is Thirty Pounds to be laid out in necessary
buildings upon my said Plantation at the Discretion of my said
Wife

And Lastly I do nominate, constitute and appoint my
Loving Wife and Morris Jones to be my Executors of this
my last Will and Testament revoking and disannulling all
other Will and Wills here before made by me In Witness where
of I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth Day of
January in the year of our Lord 1755 P. Penne
