 back Cow ^{with calf}, one mare Calf, my further will & Desire is that all
 my Cash in the house & all out at Interest shall be equally Divided between
 my son William Weymouth & my three Daughters (viz) Rebecca Weymouth
 Hannah Weymouth & Sarah Weymouth When they shall Come of Lawful
 Age or marry, my Further Will is that all the Remainder of my Cattle
 Sheep, Horses, and hogs, ^{as sold by my executor for the money} be equally Divided between my son William
 Weymouth & my ~~three~~ Daughters (viz) Rebecca Weymouth Hanna
 & Sarah Weymouth, and also Desire that all the Remainder of my
 Household Goods, ^{be equally divided as above} between my four Children (viz) William Weymouth
 Rebecca Hannah & Sarah Weymouth I also give to my three Daughters
 Rebecca Weymouth Hannah Weymouth & Sarah Weymouth all my wearing
 clothes to be equally Divided - - - and lastly I nominate and appoint
