First I bequeath the Use of the House and Lott whereon I now live

 my Will and desire that my Executors shall dispose of the
 same for the best price that can be had at twelve Months to
 the said House and Lott whereon I now live and the Money
 arising from such sale to be Equally divided between my
 sons, Thomas, my Son, Miles, Soldier Barrow and Richard
 Barrow to them and their Heirs forever, and if any of my said
 sons should die before they come to age it is my desire that
 their part shall be divided amongst my surviving sons or
 sons,

Item, I desire my Executors hereafter Named shall sell to the Best
 Bidder on giving twelve Months Credit my plantation and
 some Nine parcels of William Jennings and the Money
 arising from the sale to pay my Debts in any one of
 my Executors shall have power to convey any of my Land
 sold, only one Qualify, but if both my Executors shall be
 living at such sale they shall both join in the conveyance
 provided they both Qualify to my said Will as witness

them, I give my Daughter Elizabeth Anne Thompson one of my
Land lying in the Western Country given me by the State of
Virginia, to her and her Heirs for ever.

then, I give my Daughter Mary Jones one Thompson one of my
Land lying in the Western Country to her Heirs for ever.

It is my Will and desire that my Executors shall sell for
the best price that can be had the remainder of my Land given
me by the State for my services and the Money arising from such
sale to pay to my loving Wife for her support & my three sons

then, I give the Use of my Household & Kitchen Furniture with my
Negroes to my loving Wife during her life for the support of my
three sons and at my Wife's Death I give the Negroes with their
Linen & Furniture to be equally divided between my loving
sons & to them & their Heirs for ever.

It is my Will and desire that my Sloop be sold for the payment
of my Debts.

then, It is my Will and desire that my Military Certificate shall
be kept together with my Creditors will allow and consent
to pay my Debts and after my Debts are paid it is my Will
and desire that the remainder of my Estate of what kind
soever be equally divided between my loving Wife & three
sons to them and their Heirs for ever.

them. I hereby Nominate & Appoint my loving Wife my Executrix
 and Mr. Miles King my Executor to this my last Will
 and testament, revoking all other Wills heretofore
 made by me In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand and Affixed my seal this 16 day of June 1887.
