 sons should die before they come to age it is my desire that
 their part shall be divided amongst my surviving sons or
 sonnes,

Item, I desire my Daughters here after named shall call to the Hys
 Bidder on giving twelve Months notice of my plantation and
 same Rumpochard of William Jennings and the Money
 arising from the sale to pay my debts in my one
 and my Daughters shall have power to convey any of my Lands
 and, only one Qualify, but if both my Daughters shall be
 living at such sale they shall both be in the conveyance
 provided they both Qualify to my said Will in writing.

them, I give my Daughter Elizabeth Jones one Thousand Dollars of
my Land lying in the Western Country to give over to the State of
Virginia, to her and her Heirs for ever -

then, I give my Daughter Mary Jones one Thousand Dollars of my
Land lying in the Western Country to her and her Heirs for ever -
It is my Will and Desire that my Executrix shall sell for
the best price that can be had the remainder of my Land given
me by the State for my Services and the Money arising from such
Sale to pay to my loving Wife for her Support & my three Sons

then, I give the use of my Mayfield & Kitchen Committee with my
Negro to my loving Wife during her life for the Support of my
three Sons and at my Wifes Death give the Negro with their
Linen & furniture to be equally divided between my loving
sons as next to them & their Heirs for ever -

it is my Will and Desire that my Stock be sold for the payment
of my debts.

then, It is my Will and Desire that my Military Certificate shall
be kept together with my Creditors will allow and shall not
tax my debts and after my debts are paid it is my Will
and Desire that the remainder of my Estate of what kind
ever be equally divided between my loving Wife & three
sons to them and their Heirs for ever -
