Item I give & bequeath to my loving Daughter Phoebe Haskins
 one negro girl named Lucy to her & her heirs for ever

Item I give & bequeath to my wife Hannah Haskins all my personal estate
 of what kind soever that I may possess at the time of my death
 after my just debts & funeral charges be paid out of it
 and after my said wife's death I give & bequeath my will is that the
 remainder of the said three negroes & personal estate be
 equally divided between my four children, Eli Haskins
 Mary Haskins, Phoebe Haskins & John Haskins to them & their
 heirs for ever

And Lastly I recommend my soul to my friends and my
 friends & Thomas Haskins my friends & my last will & Testament
 revoking and annulling all other wills & Testaments by me made
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
 twentieth day of June 1794
