beth City County and State of Virginia to constitute and
ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner
as followeth —

1 I tend to my wife Jean S. Bright my house and lot in the town
Hampton that was given to me by my brother Francis N. Bright
for and during the term of her natural life, and after her death I
give the s^d house and lot to my son Samuel Francis Bright
and his heirs for ever —

2 my will is that if in case My son Samuel should die before
he comes of age that then and in that case I give the s^d
house and lot ^{at my wife's death} to my nephew Samuel Lowry and his heirs
for ever —

3 my will is that my house and land whereon my mother now
lives, at her death be sold by My executrix hereinafter mentio-
ned and the money arising from the sale thereof to pay all my
just debts —

4 I give to my son Samuel F. Bright at my Mother's death my neg-
ro man Peter that was given to me by my Brother Francis N. Bright
to him & his heirs for ever —

5 I give to my wife Jean S. Bright all my personal property con-
sisting of horses, cattle, sheep, hogs, household and kitchen furni-
ture, plantation utensils, & all money that is due to me to her &
her heirs for ever —

6 I give to my son Samuel F. Bright my Mare colt called fly, to him
& his heirs for ever —

7 my Will is that I give to my wife's daughter Mary Ann Cooper Latimer
her choice of one cow & calf to her and her heirs for ever — Lastly I
nominate & appoint my wife Jean S. Bright my executrix to this my
last will & Testament ~~in~~ & my desire is that my wife may not be held
to security, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
May 1803 — the words ^{in presence} at my wife's death, was intended before signed or sealed —
