 memory thanks be to God, Do make this my Last
 Will and Testament (That is to say) ~~_____~~
 Imp. I recommend my Soul to God that gave it, and
 my Body to the Earth, to be Buried in decent Christian
 Burial, at the discretion of my Executrix hereafter named
 Imp. My Will and Desire is that my Loving Mother,
 Elizabeth Pool have the Care of my two Children Eliz.
 and Susanna Baker during her life, my further
 Will and Desire is that my Loving Mother shall
 at my Death take Possession of my Personal Estate
 consisting of Seven head of Horned Cattle, Eight head
 of Hogs, one Horse and Household furniture as long
 as she lives and at her decease my Will is that my
^{and Sister Eliz. Pool} Loving Brother Robert Pool have the care of my
 two Children aforesaid, till they come of Age and
 Lastly I appoint my Loving Mother Eliz. Pool
 sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament
 hereby revoking and disannulling all other Wills
 and Testaments by me heretofore made In Witness
 whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal the
 day and Year first above Written

In the Name of God Amen, I Sarah Curle of the City of London being Sick & weak, but of sound mind and memory, do make this my last Will and Testament, in Form and manner following Viz.

I give and bequeath to my beloved Niece Sarah Curle Barraud my Negro Wench call'd Phillis & her Child call'd London, a Negro Child call'd New Year Negro Child call'd Moll together with their future Issue to her the said Sarah Curle Barraud and to her heirs for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Nephew Thomas Curle my Negro Fellow call'd Jack to him and to his heirs for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Niece Frances Newood Barraud my Negro man call'd London to her and to her heirs for ever, Provided my Loving Brother in Law Daniel Barraud, shall pay unto Mary Herbert the daughter of my beloved Brother in Law Sarah Herbert the sum of Twenty five pounds Current Money of Virginia, when she shall come of Age or marry'd, and in case of the said Child Marys death, before she come of Age or marry'd, that my said Brother in Law Daniel Barraud do pay the said Sum of Twenty five pounds unto the next Child of my said beloved Niece Sarah Herbert, when it shall come of Age or marry'd.

Item my Will and desire is that my beloved Brother in Law Daniel Barraud and in case of his death my beloved Sister in Law Sarah Barraud shall and may keep the said Negro London untill he or she shall make the said Sum of Twenty five pounds, by the hire of the said slave London, to satisfy him or her for the payment of the said Sum of Twenty five pounds.

I give and bequeath to my beloved Niece Martha Curle my Negro Girl call'd Clarissa, together with her Issue, to her the said Martha Curle and to her heirs for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Niece Sarah Curle daughter of Samuel Curle, in case she shall come to age or marry'd, my Negro Child call'd Jenny, together with her Issue, and in case of her death before she shall come of Age or marry'd, I then give the said Negro Jenny to my beloved Nephew Darby Curle, to him & to his heirs for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Niece Jane Hummerell my Negro Wench call'd Moll together with her future Issue to her the said Jane Hummerell and to her heirs for ever.

Item My Will and desire is that all the aforemention'd Slaves given as aforesaid, except the before mention'd London as before accepted be hired out after my decease, untill such time their hire will amount

to Sixty Pounds Current Money of Virginia, which sum my Will and
desire is, shall be laid out to purchase a Negro Wench, which said Wench
I give and bequeath to my beloved Niece Frances Theewill Barraud,
together with the said Wench's Issue to her the said Frances Theewill
Barraud and to her heirs for ever. Any thing before Express'd or seeming
to the contrary notwithstanding, and after the above Sixty Pounds to be
paid as aforesaid, my Will and desire is that the said Negro's given as
aforesaid shall be deliver'd up to the above Legatee, except the Negroes
given as aforesaid to my beloved Nieces Sarah Curle Barraud and
Frances Theewill Barraud, which said Negroes my Will and desire is that
my beloved Brother in Law Daniel Barraud or in case of his death to my
beloved Sister Catharina Barraud shall have the service & profits of
till my beloved Nieces Sarah Curle Barraud and Frances Theewill Barraud
shall come of Age or marry respectively, any thing herein before Express'd
or seeming to the contrary notwithstanding.

Item my Will and desire is that whatever sum shall be due me
at my decease for Negros here, or any other debts due me, be apply'd to discharge
whatever debts shall appear to be justly due my Creditors, and the Residue
of my Estate in Things for my beloved Sister Catharina Barraud
& my beloved Niece Mary Bridges, each one thing, after which
if there be any Residue, my Will and desire is that it be apply'd towards
and in stead of the Sixty Pounds or before mention'd in the purchase of a Negro
Wench for my beloved Niece Frances Theewill Barraud as before mention'd.

Lastly I Ordain constitute Nominat and appoint my
Loving Brother in Law Daniel Barraud, Mr. James Westwood and Coll:
Joseph Bridges, Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, In Witness
whereof I hereunto set my hand and affix my Seal this Twenty seventh
day of February, In the Year of Our Lord One thousand Seven
hundred and sixty four.



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the Court held for Plymouth County the 5th day of August 1766 132a

This Will was presented into Court by ~~Joseph~~ Daniel Barnard one of
the Exors therein named who made oath thereto according to Law ^{the Law} & being
proved by the Oaths of Augustine Moore & James Westwood two of the
Witnesses thereto was ordered to be recorded & on the Motion of the
Exor who entered into Bond with James Balfour his Security in the
Penalty of Pounds Certificate was granted him for
Obtaining a Probate thereof in due form Liberty being reserved to
the other Exors ^{to join in a Probate} when they shall think fit.
