

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Battt of the County of Elizabethtown  
being Sick and Weak of Body but of perfect Sence and memory Praise be Almighty  
God for his same: And falling to mind the uncertainty of this present Life, do here  
make this my last Will and Testament as follows. First I bequeath my Soul to  
Almighty God who gave it me: and my Body to be decently interred at the desire  
of my good wife after named; and for what worldly Goods I have, do give and  
Dispose of as follows.

Item. I give and bequeath to my loving Son John Battt the plantation where  
I now live, also three negroes, to wit, Peter, Judy, & Sarah, also six head  
of breeding cattle, Two Sons, Two Ewes, and one Ram, To him and his  
for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my loving Son Thomas Battt my half Lot of Land  
lying and being in Hampton Towne in the aforesaid County of Elizabethtown, also Two  
Negro men, to wit Tom & Will, to him and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my loving Daughter Lydia Battt One Negro girl  
called Moll, also the sum of Twenty Pounds in Cash, to her and her heirs for  
ever.

Item. All the rest of my effects, of Nature, or kind so ever, after my just debts  
and funeral expences are paid, I give and bequeath to my loving Son Thomas  
Battt, and to his heirs for ever.

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my loving Friends William Woff  
and Thomas Tabb to be Executors of this my will; and do revoke & renounce  
all former Wills heretofore by me made. In witness whereof I have here  
unto set my hand and affixed my seal this 21. Day of March in the  
Year of our Lord Christ 1737.8.
