In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Kerby of Warrington City County
being Sick and Weak but of sound Mind and Memory Calling to
Mind the Uncertainty of this life do Make and Ordain this my last
Will and Testament in Manner and form as follows

First, I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Sarah Kerby, my
Negro Man Ben and my girl Senny to her and her Heirs for ever
them, I send the Use of my plantation whereon I now live to my loving
Wife during her Widowhood, with liberty of getting Rice and other
Timber off my larger Swamp Land for the Use of the plantation
that she has during Widowhood

Item, I send to my loving Wife Sarah Kerby during her Widowhood
one third part of my Negroes including Ben & Senny with one third
part of my personal Estate and after my said Wifes Death or
Widowhood then give the said Slaves & personal Estate lent to
my Daughter Martha King and her Heirs for ever
them, I give to my loving Daughter after my Wifes Widowhood or Death
the plantation whereon I now live to her and her Heirs for ever

Item, I send to my loving Daughter Martha King my Negro Woman
Hannah with her four Children and their future Increase to her
during life and after her Death I give the said Negro Woman
Hannah with her four Children and their future Increase to my
Granddaughter Martha King and her Heirs for ever but if my said
Granddaughter should die Under Age and or Without Issue then give
the said Negro Woman Hannah and her Children with their Increase
to be equally divided between my Grand Child or Grand Children

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in Case I should have no such Grand Child or Grand Children then
give the said Negro Woman Hannah & her Children with their
Increase to my son in Law Miles King and his Heirs for ever
Item, I give my plantation on Sanger Swamp with all the remaining
part of my Estate of what kind soever to my loving Daughter
Martha King to her and her Heirs for ever

I Constitute & appoint my loving Wife Sarah Kerby, my son in Law Miles
King and my Daughter Martha King Executors & Administrators to this my last
will, revoking all other Wills heretofore Made by me in Witness whereof
I have hereunto sett my hand & Affix my seal this 25. day of February 1786
Signed, sealed & acknowledged to be
his last Will before us
