of Bligheth City County and Town of Hampshire being sick and
Weak but of sound Mind and Memory and Calling to Mind
the Uncertainty of this Mortal Life do Make and Ordain
this my last Will and Testament in Manner and forme
as follows

1st I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Catherine
Annointed from Mose to Will. Anthony, George and Mary
Dancy and Minet Named Black Joe, Aisling Chair
and Horse called Jack, a small Mare, One Horse
Cart, four Milk cows of the first Choice, to her and
her heirs for ever

2nd I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Catherine Annointed my Negro
Mench Named Hannah during her life and after my
Wifes Death it is my desire that the said Negro Woman
Hannah be sold and the Money to be equally divided
between my surviving Children

3rd I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Catherine Annointed my Dwelling
House where I live with
all the Orchard and Garden with my Household and
Kitchen Furniture to my loving Wife Catherine
Annointed during her life, and after her Death it is my
Will and desire that the furniture remaining shall
be disposed of and the Money be divided between my
Children then living

4th After my Wife Death I give the Dwelling House where
I now live to my Son Mose Annointed to him and his
heirs forever, but in case my said Son should die without
Issue then I desire the said House and all be sold for
the best price that can be had, and the Money to be divided
equally between my Children then living

them, I give and bequeath to my Children, Mary Ann, Ann, Amos, and
Moses Ann, and the following Negroes, Henry, Molly, Carter, Sam, Henry,
Milly, Aggy, Henry, Joe, Patty, Dennis, Charles and
Yellow Sue with there future Increase to be equally
divided amongst my said Children when ever one
of them comes to Age or Marries to them and their
Heirs for ever and after such Division if any of my
Children die before they come to Age it is my Will
and desire that such Childs part be divided between
my surviving Children and their Heirs

them, I give all my Military Certificates and my African
Certificates to be equally divided between my Children
Mary Ann, Ann, Amos, and Moses Ann and
the Children of them who ever comes to age
or Marries, and it is my further Will and desire
all the Intent of the Certificates shall be apply^d to
the support of my loving Wife & Children until the
Certificates are divided

them, It is my Will and desire that my Negroes be continued
on the Plantation of Mr. Cady Estate to Make a crop
and at the end of the Year it is my Will and desire that
my Executors hereafter Named shall dispose of such part
of the Crop as can be spared after having sufficient
for the support of my loving Wife & Children and the
Maintenance of my said Wife to be laid out for the
support of my said Wife & Children and it is my
further Will and desire that my Executors may if they
think proper vend off or hand and make the Negroes for
the benefit of my loving Wife & Children on the
said Negroes and dispose of the stock of plantation
whenever the Money arising from such this sale shall
be laid out from time to time for the support of my Wife
and Children

The Court held for Eliz. City County Thursday June the
 23rd 1786. This Will was produced in Court and proved by the
 Oath of John Ashton May & Francis Rodalchiers sons of the
 Matrimonial Thoms and Executors of the Deceased and in the Will
 of the said Thoms was the Executors named and William
 James being the Executor in the Will named who made Oath accord-
 ing to Law. Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate
 thereof in due form Whereupon they together with John Cary their
 security entered into and acknowledged Bonds in the Sd. County of
 Middlesex as the Law directs.
 And being the said Executor in the Will named came into Court
 and renounced the Executorship.
