God for the same do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner &
form as follows first and principally to commend my soul to almighty God that gave it
hoping through the merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to receive full pardon and forgiveness
of all my sins and my body to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my Ex^{or} & Co after
Honor and as to my worldly goods I give and dispose thereof as follows vizt

First I give that all my just debts be paid and discharged

Item I give and appoint that my two Negroes Sam and Liza be by my Ex^{or} & Co sold toward discharge
of my just debts
Item I give all my personal Estate to be equally divided between my wife & my daughter
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Hannah Arnimstead my two Negroes Jeffery and Jerry
to her and her heirs for ever

Item I bind the life and labour of my two Negro womenes Beck & Bess unto my loving wife Elizabeth Arnimstead
during her Natural life only and after her death I give the said two Negroes and their heirs & assigns
to be equally divided between my two youngstons Anthony Arnimstead and the young Child my wife's
last will & devised off to be is not at this time baptised to them and their heirs for ever

Many I gave and bequeathed into my loving son William. Instead my Negro boy Andrew to him
and his heirs forever

You stand the up and labors of my Negro man, safe into my extra^{or} and all his 4 years or indeed —
 towards discharging my debt and also the expiration of the said bond, some 5 years and 8 months the said
 Negro man safe into my caring for the said admitted and discharging cost —

And lastly I only remain and appoint my loving wife Elizabeth and my loving Brother Darius being head of whole sole part and part of the money last will and Testament whereby working all former and other ^{wishes} ~~to be done~~ as before made be witness whereof I have subscribed at my hand and affixed my seal this 7th day of July 1711.

In the name of God Amen I William Armistead Junr of the County of Coly: City being of sound and disposing Mind and Memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and Form following

I ~~imprison~~ I recommend my Soul to God the Creator and giver of it and my Body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named

And as to my Temporal Estate after my debts and funerals are paid and discharged

I Item I lend to my loving Wife Constance all my Estate of what Title or Claim soever during her life for the support of herself and Childred and my Will is that my Wife maintain my Son Robert Negro Slave till she can be hired out and that my Wife may have power to charge my Son Robert for his maintenance to the amount of the hire of said Negro Slave

I Item ~~I give~~ I bequeath after my Wife's death my whole Estate to be equally divided between my three Children allowing the Negro Slave to be appraised and for each Child to have equal share alike of said Estate but if my Son Robert will not agree to have his Negro appraised with my Estate my desire is that my Estate as aforesaid be equally divided between my daughter Mary and my Son ~~Robert~~ Armistead to them and their Heirs forever

Lastly I nominate and appoint my loving Wife Constance my whole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former or other Wills by me heretofore made and declaring this to be my only true last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this twentyfourth Day of February 1772
