 Mind and Memory do make and Ordain this my last
Will and Testament in Manner and Form as follows
 I give and bequeath my plantation in Warwick County Adjoining the land
 of John Swicelling to my loving Wife during her Life but
 not to alien more than 1000 in said land or plantation
 and after my loving Wife's Death, I give the said plantation
 to my son Thomas Baggett to have and his heirs forever
 I give and bequeath my two Negro Women, Kate & Betty to my loving Wife
 during her life and at her Death I give to & for the Increase
 of my Wife during her life and after my Wife's Death I give
 Betty & her Child which she bore to my Daughter
 Anne Baggett to have and her heirs forever
 I give and bequeath my Wife's Death, Kate & Betty & the Increase except
 Betty & her Child, to be equally divided between my son
 Thomas Baggett & my daughter Anne Baggett to have
 and their heirs forever
 I give and bequeath to my wife during her life the Appraisement and I sell
 my loving Wife Anne with the consent of my children to allow'd
 to take it & the Appraisement to make use of so long as she
 lives and at her Death to be equally divided between my
 children

Stam, the other half of my personal estate it is my desire shall
be sold and the Money paid out by Intest and the Interest
to go towards the support of my wife and when my said
children should come to Age in Maine it is my desire
that the Money put to Interest in 1830 be divided between
my said children in equal parts.

Stam - I in my Will and desire that my Executors hereafter named
do have my things sold and the Money paid out as above.

Stam - and I appoint my loving Wife the guardian of my estate
during her life in consequence of the same she is to take care
and bring up my children until they are old enough to
be put out to the world as they may see fit.

Stam - if my loving Wife should have any small children or child
it is my further Will and desire that such child or children
shall have an equal share of my personal estate
as my Wife I wish with my other children, except the
said child.

Lastly - I now write and appoint, Mr Thomas H. Johnson
Master of my executors to receive, collect and
and also the other with him to make and receive the same.
I have hereunto set forth my hand and seal this 10th day of June 1836.
