 form following, after my Funeral expences and Just Debts are paid
 I give and bequeath to my loving Son John Face. the Land or
 lott of ground which came by his mother, and known by the name
 of Edward Pennys to him and his heirs for ever.
 I also give to my said Son John Face, one Negro man named
 Jack to him and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Edward Face, The House and one
 third of a lott of ground in the Town of Hampton which I pur-
 chased of John Cook to him and his heirs for ever.
 I also give and bequeath to my said Son Edward Face, one negro
 Girl known by the name of Janet to him and to his heirs
 for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Charity Chapman
 the Brick House and three eighths of a lott of ground in the Town
 of Hampton whereon I now live, to her and to her heirs for ever.

Item. What may remain after my Funeral expences, and Just Debts are
 paid, I desire may be equally divided amongst my Sons John
 Face, Edward Face, and my grand Daughter Charity Chapman
 to them and to their heirs for ever.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my loving
 Sons John and Edward Face, to be my Executors to this my last
 Will and Testament, hereby making Null and void all other Wills
 heretofore by me made. - In Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and affixed my Seal this 6th day of September 1771
