I William Goode of Eliz. City County being sick and weak
in body but of perfect mind and memory thankes to Almighty
God for the same do make and ordain this to be my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following

Item I send unto my beloved wife Sarah Goode the use of my
House and plantation and three Negroes viz Harry, Abigail
and one other my personal estate belonging to me Daughter to be
got to bring up my Children upon her death I give the said
plantation unto my Son William Goode to him and his Heirs
for ever at the Death of my loving Wife.

Item I give and bequeath at the Death of my beloved wife
Sarah Goode the said three Negroes and if there should be
any increase also all my personal estate to be equally
divided between my Three Children Viz William Goode
Polly Goode and Elizabeth Goode except Twenty Pounds
Fifty Shillings which I have due me in King William
County which the balance due for Land I sole then to be
equally divided between my Two Daughters Polly Goode
and Elizabeth Goode as extraordinary, and if there should
be a Decrease of either of my Daughters before they should
come of age or be married my Will and desire is that all
my personal estate shall be equally divided between my
children that shall be living.

I do nominate and appoint my Loving wife Sarah Goode
and my son William Goode my sole and Sole Executor and
Executor of this my Last Will and Testament ratifying
and confirming this and no other to be my Last Will
and Testament whereof I the said William Goode do
hereby set my hand and seal the Day and year above
written
