Item my Land Give to my Son allen Wholland
provided he should Die before he arrives
to the age of twenty one years ~~or~~ or have
Lawfull Heirs Then I Give the Said
Land to my Son John Wholland and if
he should Die with out Lawfull heirs
then I Give the Said Land to my Daughter
Mary Wholland and her Heirs
and I Do hereby nominate and appoint

my loving wife Mary in person and Thomas
Minson on Ioandam my whole Executors of this
my Last will and testament here by making
void all former Wills by me or for me made
In testimony where of I have herunto set
my hand and seal this 29 day of January 1789

Elizabeth City County Court January 28th 1790
This Will was produced in Court and proved by the
Oath of Samuel Dumble & Richd Young two
of the executors thereof (and ordered to be read
~~the said~~ Mary McCallan the Executrix therein
named personally appeared in Court and religio-
usly testified the Executorship thereof, And on the motion of
Miles Ring Gen. who made Oath according to law, Certificate
is granted him for obtaining Letters of Administration
with the said Will annexed, Whereupon he together
with Genl George Peckham Genl. Geo. Lewis Jr. interposed
an acknowledged Bond in the Penalty of two hundred
Pounds. Conditioned as the Law directs
