 and after her Decease to my son John Howe alias Mortoway and his heirs for ever. Item I give  
 and bequeath unto my son John Howe alias Mortoway all y<sup>e</sup> remaining part of my estate be it of  
 what nature or kind never to him and his heirs for ever excepting one house and land which I give  
 unto Martha Moody wife of John Moody Junr Item it is my will that if my son John Howe  
 alias Mortoway should Die before his aforesaid age of twenty one years or Lawfull time that then  
 I give unto Mr. Nathaniel Greenhill one negro or Negroe boy about five pounds Sterl to be at y<sup>e</sup> command  
 Shryne w<sup>t</sup> he a negro to his heirs for ever. Item I give all the rest of my estate out of y<sup>e</sup> prov<sup>r</sup>  
 that my son Howe alias Mortoway should Die before y<sup>e</sup> age aforesaid and leave full estate unto my  
 god son & Husband & Bro<sup>r</sup> and my god daughter Cordelia Driftord to be equally divided  
 between them & their heirs for ever and I do appoint my son John Howe alias Mortoway  
 May<sup>r</sup> William Dangeford Esq<sup>r</sup> to keepe my last will & Testament & to execute it according to the  
 will & direction heretofore made by me in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affig<sup>d</sup>
