Will & Testament in manner & form following, first & principally I commend
my Soul to God that gave it, and my body to the Earth to be decently interred
according to the discretion of my Executors hereafter named, hoping & assuredly
believing through the Merits & Mediation of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ
to obtain pardon & remission of my sins & to receive a joyful resurrection
And as to what worldly estate God in his Mercy has bestowed upon me I give
& bequeath as followeth, I Item I give Devise & bequeath unto my brother
Henry Berry all the Land I have in Arundel County, given & bequeathed
to me by the last Will & Testament of my dear father Henry Berry, to him
his heirs for ever. Item I give Devise and bequeath my plantation Land
& premises where I now live (my wife Ann Berry's Thirds or Dower accord-
ing to Law out of my fo Land only excepted) unto my Daughter Ann
Berry & her heirs Lawfully begotten but in case my sd Daughter should
die without said heirs then I give & bequeath the same to my afored brother
Henry Berry & his heirs for ever, Item my will & desire is that my afored
wife Ann Berry enjoy so much of my estate as the Law allows her only
Item all my personal estate of what nature or quality soever I give and
bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Berry. Lastly I do ordain constitute &
appoint my wife Ann Berry & my brother Henry Berry Executors of this
my last Will & Testament revoking & disallowing all former Wills by me
made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my Seal
this 21 day of March 1719.

In the name of God Amen I John Bourne of the County of Essex and parish of St. Marys being very sick & weak in body but in perfect sense and memory thanks be to God for his sake do make this my last will & testament: committing my soul to God that gave it and my body to the Earth to be interred according to the disposition of my last will & testament: I do hereby declare that after my debts and funeral charges & aid the rest of my worldly estate to be paid of as follows. I do constitute and appoint my loving wife Ann Bourne to be the whole & sole executrix of this my last will and testament. I do give to my son John Bourne the plantation I now live on and all the land adjoining to it (that is meaning all the land I hold) to him & his heirs for ever but in case my son John dies without issue lawfully begotten I give it to my son Andrew Bourne and his heirs for ever and if he dies without issue lawfully begotten I give it to my son Robert Bourne and his heirs for ever but if he dies without issue lawfully begotten I give it to my son Francis Bourne to him & his heirs for ever and if he dies without issue lawfully begotten I give it to my son Henry Bourne & his heirs for ever and in case they all dye without heirs I leave it to be equally divided between my two daughters Christian and Sarah Bourne to them & their heirs for ever. I do give to my loving wife Ann Bourne all my goods & chattels for ever to be at her sole power & disposal. I do give to my son Robert Bourne my 100 shillings to him and his heirs for ever but if he dies without issue lawfully begotten I give
