I Thomas Davie of Essex County & parish of St. Anne being weak of body But of good and perfect sound memory do Enfilate and Ordaine this my last will & Testament making void all other by me before made: In witness I Beseech my Deity God that gave it and my Body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named. I will that all my just debts be paid. I have I give unto my Son Sam^l Davie the hundred acres of Land I purchased of Rich^d Stok^e to him and his heirs for ever and if my Son Sam^l dy^e without such heirs lawfully begotten then I give & bequested Land to my Sons John and James Davie to be equally divided to them and their heirs for ever. I have I give unto my Son Thomas Davie that hundred acres of Land I first purchased of Humphrey Brooke to him and his heirs for ever and if my Son Thomas dy^e without heirs lawfully begotten then he bequested Land I give to my Son Francis Davie to him and his heirs for ever. I have I give to my Loving wife Francis Davie the plantation whereon I now live and after her decease I give it my Son Nicholas Davie to him and his heirs for ever. Likewise I give to my Loving wife my negro woman Dede and after her de^{ce} to my Daughter Ann Davie Reserving her furniture for my three youngest Sons Francis John & James.
