house and orchards thereto appertaining to him and his heirs. Item
I give and bequeath to John Gore all my Estate after my Just debts paid pro-
-rall to him and his heirs for ever. Lastly I do constitute and appoint
William Young my whole Executor of this my last will and Testament as
witness my hand and seal this 11 day of January 1778
