Item it is my will & desire that my Son Jeremiah Sheppard be carefully put to school for the sum of one whole year & if in case that my said wife Elizabeth do remain a widow after my decease then such sum that my aboougt Son Jeremiah come to the age of one & twenty years that then my aboougt Son do live with his mother without any provision but in case that my said wife doe marry that my aboougt Son Jeremiah at the age of eighteen be free for himself & to take & demand his aboougt part of my Estate into his hands & to act & do as he shall think fit. Memorandum that my Brother Robt Sheppard stand justly indebted to me five hundred pounds of good sound sweet leather tobacco & laths & that after that Estate paid into my share that then I do constitute & appoint my loving wife Eliz. A. Sheppard & my brother Robert Sheppard my whole and sole executors of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal in the presence of the present witnesses —

In the name of God amen I John Douglass of the parish of St. Ann's in the County of Essex, being very sick & weak in body but in perfect sense and memory Thanks be to almighty God for the same, do hereby constitute & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form as followeth, Inasmuch I give & bequeath my soul to almighty God that gave it me, trusting in the meditations & merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to receive eternal life & happiness, and my body to the earth from whence it came, to be interred as the will of my testatrix, testator — mentioned, shall think fit; And for what worldly goods God hath been pleased to bless me with which is more then my deserts (after my just debts are paid) I give & bequeath as followeth viz: to Item I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Susanna Douglass the plantation wherein now live, —

including the one half of the Land I live on to her during her natural life, and after her decease, I give and bequeath the said Land to my son Augustine Boughan with all the remainder of the said Estate of Land I live on to him & his heirs for ever, Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Boughan all the Land I have in & upon the Head of Ristabury to him & his heirs for ever, Item I leave my Loving wife Susanna Boughan the one third part of all my Negroes with their increase to her during her natural life, and after her decease her to negroes and their increase I give & bequeath to my four children Dorothy Mary Augt^t & John Boughans and their heirs for ever to be equally divided, Item I give and bequeath all the remainder of Negroes with their increase to be equally divided amongst my four children Dorothy Mary Augustine & John Boughans and that my Executrix hereafter named have the management thereof until one of my said children shall arrive to the age of eighteen years or the day of marriage and then all the said negroes aforesaid given to my said four children be equally divided amongst the said four children, or if any of them dead then amongst the survivors and that, That child so of age then have his or her equal part, and the remainder of the said Negroes remain to the remainder of the said children until another of them shall arrive to the age aforesaid or married and then he or she have his or her equal part as aforesaid, and so the rest to remain in manner & form aforesaid till all my said children shall come to the age aforesaid or married, Item I give and bequeath all the remainder of my Estate both real & personal to be equally divided amongst my Loving wife Susanna Boughan and my four children Dorothy Mary Augustine & John Boughans and their heirs for ever, Lastly I do Ordain Substitute & appoint my Loving wife Susanna Boughan my whole sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 13th day of February 1719.
