 for ever to be equally divided between them. and y^e my son Anthony & after
 the plantation whereon now live the said then I give bequeath all the rest of my
 real & personal in what nature soever to be equally divided amongst my
 young wife Elizabeth my son John my son William my son Peter

my Daughter Sarah & my daughter Anne & to their heirs to be Equally Divi-
-ed as they come to age & do constitute & appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Solo Legat-
