power of his blessed word. I do hereby testify and witness that I have been and am now a free man and a free man
at the last Day and my body being bound in the Detention of the said Honor for said and last for the said year of
the fourth year of the said and fourth in number of years following.

Mem. I was born for Thomas Wonder as a child.

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Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Anstrong one Shilling.

Item I give to my Daughter Sarah Subill one Shilling.

Item my daughter is that my two sons shall keep their one Shilling without repayment.

Item I give to my Daughter Mary Wadde one Shilling.

Item I give to my son Jacob Wadde a small part of Land lying upon Thomas Wadde's Land and running up to the Church road that goes from my house down a long road to the Church with it and the land that goes to the Church so down the bank till it comes to the fence of the Church where it begins and from the fence to the last beginning and the rest of my lands I give to my other four sons to be equally divided with all my house and Ornaments belonging and I do appoint my two sons John Wadde and Jacob Wadde my lawful Executors. Item I give to my son John Wadde one Shilling to be appraised and the rest of my lands to be equally divided among my four sons and I do appoint my two youngest sons Robert and Benjamin and so I do leave my son Jacob Wadde to do after them for three years and that they will not be in force till my death at witness my hand and seal the 17 day of October 1721.
