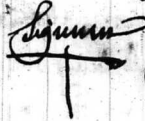
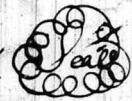


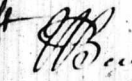

In the name of God amen I John Taliferro of the County of St. Marys in the County of Kent being of sound & perfect mind & memory praise be therefore given to almighty God do make & ordain this my present last will & Testament in manner & form following that is to say first & principally I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping through the merits Death & passion of my Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ to be made a partaker of & have sharing joys of immortality at the joyful resurrection, and my body I commit to the earth to be decently interred at the direction of my Executors hereafter named and as touching the disposal of such Temporal Estate as it shall please God to bestow on me I do order give bequeath & dispose this same in manner & form following — First I will that my Legal Debts be all paid & satisfied. Item I give unto my son Lawrence the plantation he now lieth together with the Land thereto belonging to him & his heirs for ever also three negro's named Sam: Wats and Bob now in his possession. Item I give unto my son John the plantation whereon he now lieth together with the Land thereto belonging to him & his heirs for ever also two negro's namely Branch & Mary now being in his possession and likewise some grounds near the house of the plantation I give unto my daughter Elizabeth during & right heirs of her marriage of which being a part of a former plantation she is married to. Item I give unto my son Charles

Three hundred acres of Land lying & being in a North & northerly known by the name
 of the old ~~South~~ North Neck within the above parish of St. Marys, and one moiety of a tract
 of Land taken up and patented by me in partnership with my brother Francis Taliaferro
 deceased lying at the head of the Mount Creek the both parcels of the sd Land to him
 and his heirs for ever, I then I give unto my son Robert six hundred & seventy five acres
 of Land being one moiety of a Dividend lying in the Golden-bale Swamp to him &
 his heirs for ever, I then I give unto my son Zachariah six hundred & seventy five
 acres of Land being the other moiety of the sd Dividend of Land lying in Golden
 bale Swamp to him & his heirs for ever. I then my wife is that the above thirteen
 hundred and fifty acres of Land given to my two sons Robt. & Zachariah be divided as
 equally y^t. each of them may have an equal part of the good Land. I then I give
 unto my son Richard one moiety of the Land I now live on (viz) the back half
 of the Dividend to him & his heirs for ever, I then I give unto my son William
 (viz) the front part of the Dividend together with the plantation thereon to him & his
 heirs for ever, I then whereas the Land above mentioned lying at the head of the Mount was
 taken up and patented by me in partnership with my sd deceased brother Francis
 Taliaferro but no division thereof between us made, and whereas in the life time of my
 brother I did purchase of him to me & my heirs for ever one hundred acres (more
 or less) of Land lying on Rappahannock River and adjoining to one thousand acres of
 Land formerly by my sd deceased brother to me given the which said land not being
 recorded in any Court of record &c. my wife & Desire is upon my sd deceased brother
 her at Law his affirming acknowledging and making sure the above purchased
 one hundred acres (more or less) unto my son John that then be my sd son John
 (whom I do hereby empower so to do) do affirm & make sure the lower moiety
 of the sd Dividend of Land lying at the head of the Mount Creek as above
 unto said heir of my sd deceased brother so doing. I then I add further my will
 is that if either of them my sd sons Robt. & Zachariah shall happen to dye before
 they attain to the age of one and twenty years that then the whole thirteen hundred &
 fifty acres of Land become the Survivour of them & his heirs for ever, I then and further
 my wife is that if either of them my sd sons Richard & William shall happen to
 dye before they attain to the age of one and twenty years that then the whole
 six hundred acres of Land become the Survivour of them to him & his heirs
 for ever, I then my will is that my whole personal Estate goods & chattels my
 wife & negroes do remain together entire without Distribution & that the same
 yearly made be kept at the discretion of my after named Executors to pay what
 legal debts due from me & wife money to discharge & pay the Legacies here in
 before given which Debts when satisfied & Legacies discharged, my wife is that the
