In the name of god amen I John Willm of the parish of St. Ann in the County of Essex being Sitt & resident of the but of the Court & Memory promised be given to god for the said and knowing the uncertainty of this life and that it is appointed for all men to dye and by Desires to settle justly as god of his just merit hath been pleased to bless me with do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following First I Give and bequeath unto my Son John Willm all my Land to hold to him & his heirs Lawfully begotten of his body for ever, only reserving to my Loving & Beloved daughter Mary of the parish of St. Andrew in the County of Middlesex a house & garden which I have been to be bounded at Fothermole from the Road that shall grow in the year 1720 to the parish of St. Andrew to the parish of St. Andrew and that she hold the same during her natural life

I am making this my last will and testament in the presence of the witnesses who are named in the said will and who are of the County of Essex and who are of the parish of St. Andrew and who are of the age of 21 years or upwards

Under Bond. life and that she make no use of any Timber but what shall be
 for if. life benefit of it. to plantarow and the produce thereof. Item
 it is my Will that my Son John Mills have full power over all my
 Land for Timber when he shall come to the age of twenty one years
 or day of Marriage which shall first happen, and if my said Son should
 die without heirs as aforesaid then it is my Will that my Daughter
 Mary Mills, after my wife Death have hold & enjoy that part of
 my Land given to my said wife as aforesaid to her my said Daughter &
 the heirs of her body lawfully begotten for ever and all the other part

 of my aforesaid wife and to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten
 for ever, provided my Son John Mills die without heirs as aforesaid, then
 I give to my Daughter Sarah Williams twelve pounds in full consider-
 ation of all my estate real & personal. Item I give to my Daughter
 Rebecca Younger twelve pounds in full consideration of all my estate
 real & personal. Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth the daughter
 of my now wife two cows and calves to be delivered to her at the
 age of eighteen or day of Marriage which shall first happen with their
 furniture Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth twelve pounds
 in full consideration of all my estate real & personal. Item I give
 to my Daughter Martha Spicers twelve pounds in full consideration
 of all my estate real & personal. Item I give to my Daughter Mary
 Mills the daughter of three years old and one young child to be delivered
 to her at the age of eighteen or the day of Marriage which shall first
 happen with all their furniture Item it is my Will that after my
 Death and there be any Debt and then shall be any plantarow & and
 otherwise which owing to be appaid to the use of my family Item I
 give to my Son John Mills one hundred and two shillings and my
 two parts of silver and comfort & that it be delivered to him when
 we shall attain to the age of twenty one years or day of Marriage
 which shall first happen, Item it is my Will that my Son John Mills
 have two years schooling and it be paid out of my estate not in this
 my will before bequeathed, and for as much of my estate it is my
 Will that it be divided between my loving wife & my Son John
 Mills my wife to have two thirds my Son one third & so forth
 shall ordain & appoint my loving wife William Mills and
 William General Executor of this my last Will & Testament
